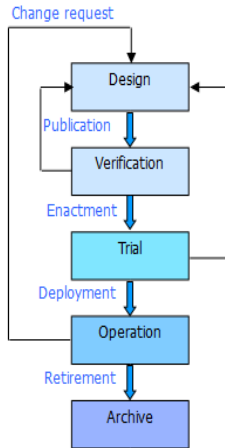


iPB – agile BPM suite with ...

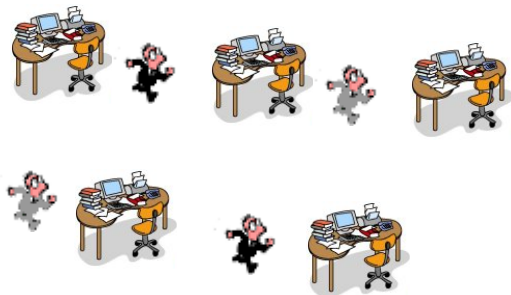
... focus on operation

- ◆ **People**, not machines, drive business processes
- ◆ **Success** in a BPM project requires introduction of a Business Process Support (BPS) system
- ◆ **Quick** introduction of a BPS system rather than spending months or years in a BP optimization project
- ◆ **Understandable** for business people untrained in BPM

... shared spaces architecture



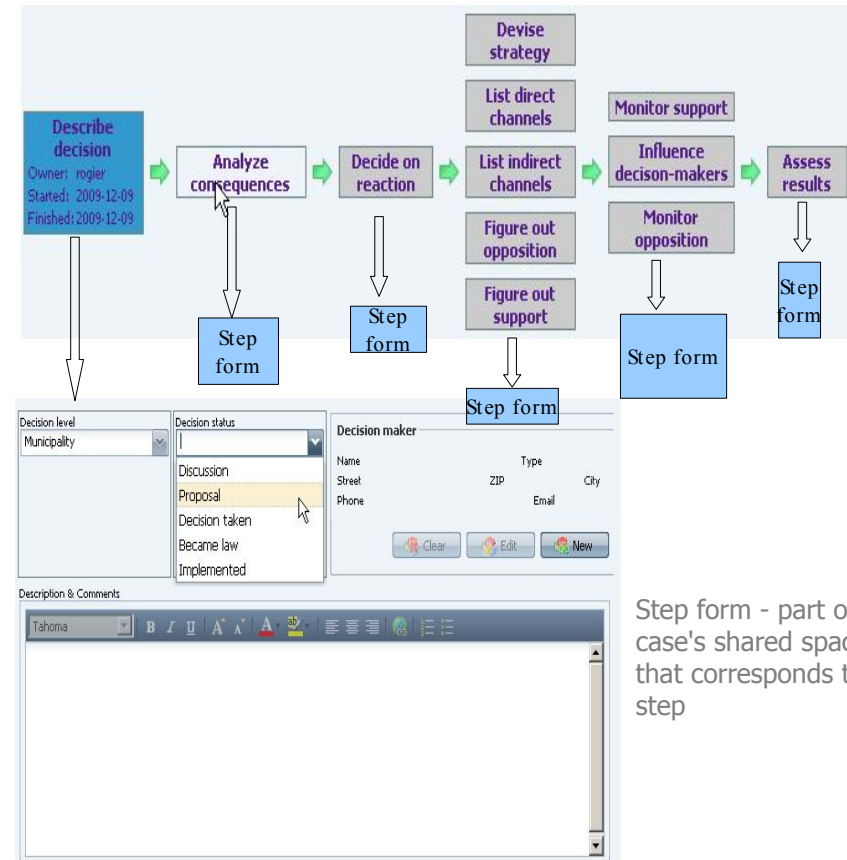
- No explicit information/communication flow
- All information is obtained from the case's shared space
- All reports are left in the case's shared space

A map serves as:

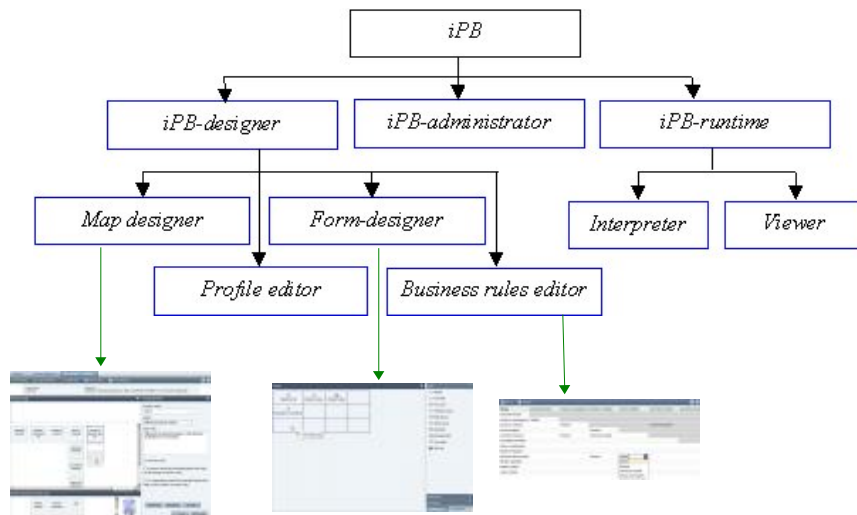
- an overview of the case/instance

... rich functionality

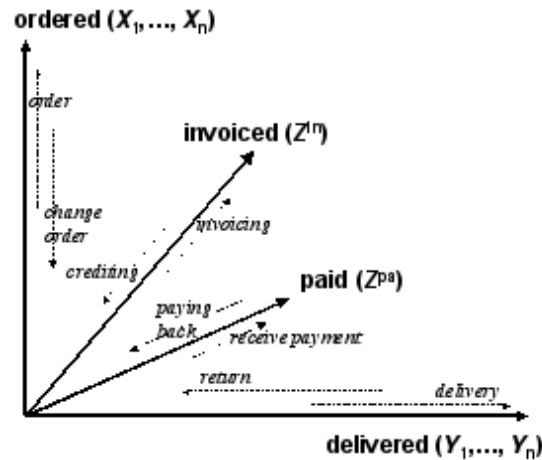

... modern technical platform

- ◆ Based on flexible Open Source WEB 2.0 platform
- ◆ Requires no installation on client machines, can run on all popular WEB-browsers. Requires no expert knowledge on BPM or programming
- ◆ Delivered as a service
- ◆ Developed using Open Source languages and tools: Ruby, Ruby on Rails, MySQL, JavaScript, ExtJS
- ◆ Ready for integration with existing legacy software via WEB-services. Customized extensions, automation, and statistical reports are available on request
- ◆ Localizable for any natural language and business dialect/slang

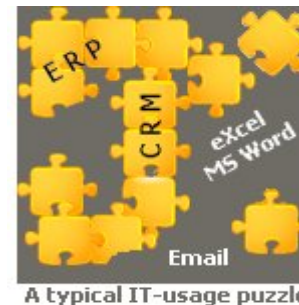
... solid theoretical foundation



- State-oriented view on BP
- Business process instance = trajectory in a multidimensional state space
